WELCOME FROM OUR CEO AND BOARD CHAIR

Marking a year of transformation and progress

For the Compass Health community, 2023 was a year of transformation. We made meaningful progress on key projects enabling even greater momentum in the future. From our largest-ever capital project to telehealth technology, and from our team's internal culture to revitalizing the way we represent the agency, we've continued to put important building blocks in place and invest in the infrastructure needed to meet our communities' evolving needs.

In the fall, we broke ground on Phase II of our Broadway Redevelopment project in Everett, taking time to commemorate the milestone with elected officials, donors, community partners, team members and advocates who are working to make the project a reality. When complete, this state-of-the-art facility will enable us to serve the region with a comprehensive destination for crisis stabilization, housing 32 beds and intensive programs focused on intervention, stabilization, and prevention. This project is truly an opportunity to purposefully design an environment from the ground up to best serve our clients, team members, and community.

Thanks to capital investments from federal, state and local leaders, along with generous

philanthropists, foundations and private investors funds not normally available to Compass Health have been directed to this \$71.05 million purpose-designed facility. We eagerly anticipate the completion and reopening of Phase II, returning to serving some of our region's most vulnerable people in the downtown Everett core.

This year saw more clients returning to inperson care – a welcome post-pandemic shift with opportunities for individuals and family members to (re)establish face-to-face connections with their care team. Even with this shift, we're continuing to realize the value of our ongoing investments in virtual care, enabling clients to engage in sessions from home and placing telehealth stations and other convenient locations to help increase access and overcome issues with transportation, scheduling and other barriers to care.

Another crucial investment we have been directing our energy towards is Diversity, Equity, Inclusion and Belonging (DEIB). In 2023, we rolled up our sleeves to get to work on this initiative, hosting nine conversational and learning sessions that provided safe spaces for team members to learn, discuss, reflect,



and explore a number of topics in this space. We also hosted four speakers who shared their personal insights on important topics: Asian-Pacific Heritage Month, PRIDE month, Juneteenth, and Native American Heritage Month. We firmly believe that these efforts will strengthen the resiliency of Compass Health's culture and expand our awareness and understanding of experiences different from our own – better equipping us to successfully engage with those we serve.

Finally, you will notice that our 2023 annual report features a fresh look and feel. This year we were proud to launch our new Compass Health brand identity, developed with the insights and input of stakeholders from across our teams and community, and designed purposefully to reflect our agency's values. Everyone belongs at Compass Health – and our new brand reflects that. Whether you have a touchpoint with us through our website, at a regional PRIDE event, or by visiting a facility, we want you to feel welcome. These areas of focus – increased access to care, a next-generation facility, space for inclusion and belonging – all reflect the continuous evolution taking place at Compass Health. Of course, our ongoing growth and transformation – and our ability to help change lives in our communities – is possible thanks to your continued support and interest in our work. We are grateful to have you along on this journey with us.

CARING FOR OUR COMMUNITY

At Compass Health, we are part of the community safety net for the most vulnerable members of our community.

Our continuum of care ensures that whenever or wherever individuals need help, we can be there, adjusting or adding services as needed. Throughout our five-county region, we offer numerous services ranging from outpatient therapy to intensive inpatient care, and we partner with various entities throughout Northwest Washington to leverage our respective strengths. Last year, Compass Health served 11,927 individuals, many of whom interacted with us on multiple occasions.

What is a Point of Care?

A point of care represents an interaction with Compass Health. Whether it is an appointment or a night stay in one of our inpatient programs, each of these instances count, for the purposes of this report, as a point of care to demonstrate the breadth of work taking place with those we serve on an annual basis. While some people may only interact with us once, and others may interact with us multiple times a week, if each client interacted with us equally, it would mean they have 18.3 points of care per year with Compass Health.
